Update on Christian Persecution in India

Recently, Hindu radical forces motivated government officials to demolish the Shalem Prayer house, an independent church in Telangana, India. The prayer house was only a temporary shed made of bamboo and thatch, built to serve as the house of worship around 100 Christians, 11 years ago. Without prior notice, Hindu radicals, in the presence of local media and local police, bulldozed the church to the ground in a few minutes, destroying everything, including fans, musical instruments, tube lights, chairs. Some Christian appealed for the bulldozers to stop as there were around 10 Christians inside holding a prayer meeting.

Officials justified the demolition by saying the church illegally occupied government land. That is true, but the entire village, including more than 500 homes and several Hindu temples are also built on the same government land and none of them are on the list for demolition.

This incident is just one of an increasing list of persecution against Christians in India. The Indian government, now led by the Hindu nationalist party, is turning a blind eye to attacks against any religious minorities.

Please pray for:

- Protection for Christians especially those who are active in sharing the gospel or have converted from Hinduism, who are frequently targeted.
- Religious freedom in India. Many states have introduced anti-conversion laws, and the Government would like to introduce these on a national level.
- Open Doors supporting persecuted believers with urgent relief aid as well as long-term community development projects.

Blaby Baptist Church November 2016. The vision for our future.

Blaby Baptist Church has become a real family where there is laughter and fun, sadness and tears, enjoyment of life, disagreements – and misunderstandings to be sorted out-a family whose life is centred on Jesus Christ and His love. People are welcomed in and accepted for who they are.

It is a church that has grown both numerically and spiritually and has a large community now using the building during the week-a community who looks on it as "home." On our first vision day, the Rev Dianne Tidball encouraged us by saying we were called to be Blaby Baptist Church with its own character and style. She compared the churches to a bowl of orange fruit-oranges, nectarines, mandarins and satsumas. They all belong to one family but are all different. In the same way, we belong to the family of Christian and Baptist churches but we are not called to be a Whetstone or a Sutton Elms or a Holy Trinity or an All Nations. We are called to be Blaby Baptist Church in this community with a character that is firmly centred on Jesus Christ. All that we are and all that we do comes out of His love for us and our love for Him. We are called to continue to grow a church that is centred on Him and characterised by His love for us and our love for one another.

There are a number of areas where we are called to grow in the future.

Worship

Worship is the offering of the whole of our life sacrificially to God. On a Sunday morning, we come together as a church in corporate worship which includes music, prayer, scripture readings and a talk in a relaxed atmosphere. The overall style is generally informal with a structure that allows it to be accessible to those coming into the church for the first time. This is important so that people feel secure. Therefore, for the immediate future we will generally maintain this structure for our morning service.

In the New Year, we do plan to extend our style of worship by starting a monthly Sunday evening service with a different format. It will include prayers, scripture, a talk and a longer time of music.

Whatever the style of corporate worship it is essential that it is led by the Holy Spirit to take us into times of intimacy with our Lord. For our part, it is important to come ready to give ourselves to Him and expectant to hear from Him.

Discipleship

Discipleship is about learning more about Jesus and becoming more like him. We already have a bible study/prayer group and Alpha where people can ask questions about their faith. In the New Year, we plan to start house groups each of which will have their own flavour but give people an opportunity for fellowship and spiritual growth within a smaller group.

Growing the church spiritually is a shared responsibility.

Mission/Serving our community

At our recent vision day we were given the words-

"Bring my people half-way and I will meet them there."

The mission of the church is to provide opportunities for people to encounter the love and good news of eternal life that Jesus offers. We do that by loving and serving our community

here in Blaby. We will continue to support the groups that use our building-practically and with prayer- and ensure that they feel welcome here. We need to offer the community a place where they feel secure to be the people they are-accepted and loved as Jesus loves them-and free to ask the big questions of life without feeling judged. We will continue to provide opportunities for this to happen as our relationship with the community grows. "Café-style" services for our Rainbows/Brownies/Guides/Rangers will continue as will Christingles for all groups. Assemblies will continue at Stokes School and we will continue to run a summer holiday club. There will also be other one-off events that will provide an opportunity to serve the community.

On a practical note, we plan to start the building of the new kitchen in the spring-trusting God for the remaining finances.

However, our welcome must go beyond a Sunday morning.

After supper on the night that he was betrayed Jesus took off his outer garment, wrapped a towel around his waist and washed the feet of his disciples. Washing feet was the dirtiest job that one could perform and it was only done by the lowest of slaves. Jesus' act was a symbol of his servanthood. When he had finished, he said to his disciples, "This is my example to you. I have washed your feet. Now go and wash the feet of others."

As a church, we are called to serve as Jesus served and this may take us into places that are difficult and even places that we may not want to go. But wherever these are we must be obedient to God's call to share His love in a practical way.

Jesus commanded us to-

Love one another as I have loved you

Love your neighbour as yourself

This is our call to the community.

Prayer

All of this must be underpinned with prayer. We cannot be God's church without His guidance and His power. We have no power of our own but we do have the power of His Holy Spirit and so must always pray, "Come Holy Spirit. Fill us and equip us to be your church here in Blaby."

It is all about Jesus being the centre of His church so we pray, "Your kingdom come and Your will be done."

We look forward to what God is going to do here in the future.













Remembrance Sunday

Remembrance Sunday saw the church full with family and friends coming to remember and give thanks to God for all those who had served in war to give us the freedom that we enjoy today. The Rainbows, Brownies, Guides and Rangers joined us parading from the war memorial on Northfield Park to the church. This year the girls not only brought their standards and their official wreath but also wreaths that they had made from poppies and hand prints. We laid poppies at the foot of the cross to remember all those who had serve in the conflicts of the twentieth century and remembered the fallen with two minutes of silence.

This year Clifford Hart was awarded the Legion d'Honneur-the highest award that France give to those who served in France during the world war and it was a privilege to hear him talk -very humbly-about his time in France. His granddaughter-in-law Lauren sang for us, reducing many to tears with her

stunning voice.

It was a very special time.













If you are seeking a closer, more intimate relationship with the Lord, then come along and join us for these meetings















